French

In French we are learning animal names and phrases to communicate whether we have pets.

Lifeskills

Maths

As mathematicians, we will build on our Year 4 knowledge. We will particularly broaden our understanding of decimals and fractions, relating to place value and calculation strategies. We will continue to practise our times tables and learn strategies to support our arithmetic skills.

Science

As scientists, we will be exploring levers, pulleys and gears. As well as learning the differences between these, we will take part in investigations to embed the knowledge learnt.

<u>Art</u>

As artists, we will experiment with collage. We will make Tudor houses using mixed media, drawing upon the techniques of artists such as Barbara Shaw. We will explore joining fabrics and paper in different ways, including stitching and layering.

PE

Monday: Health and fitness.

We will be learning about why it is important to stay fit and healthy, what activities can help us stay fit and healthy and touch upon the importance of the cardiovascular system.

Thursday: Basketball.

We will be developing specific skills relating to passing, throwing and scoring, as well as team strategies relating to

invasion and defense.




Additional information about learning


- In the Autumn term, Year 5 have PE on Mondays and Thursdays.

Reading







In Year 5, we encourage all children to read widely. This way, they will become familiar with many different types of language and writing. They will talk about and explore their understanding of a wide range of books including stories, non-fiction, poetry, and play-scripts.

How to support at home

Reading:

- Reading every day
- ► Reading out loud to your child
- Questioning about the text
- Checking they are reading a variety of literature
- Completing the books they start
- Reading records completed

English

- This year, the children will continue to develop their writing skills
 using the year 5/6 national curriculum objectives
- We will use a wide variety of texts to immerse the children and develop their stamina for writing.
- Spellings Spelling rules and common exception words will be taught twice a week and picked up in writing through 'Focus Five'
- · Weekly spellings will be sent home on Friday

Maths

- · This year, children will learn about the following areas of Maths:
 - Place Value (relating to decimal fractions)
 - Negative Numbers
 - Money
 - Short multiplication and short division methods
 - Area and scaling
 - Multiplying and dividing decimals by 10, 100 and 1000
 - o Factors, multiples and prime numbers
 - Fractions (multiplying fractions by whole numbers, finding fractions of amounts and finding equivalent fractions).
 - Converting units of measure
 - Angles and geometry, including how to use a protractor
- They will continue to develop their fluency in solving arithmetic-style questions, through regular assessments and practise opportunities, and will be encounter reasoning and problem solving questions each lesson.
- The children will continue to practise and embed their times table facts this year, focusing on applying them in a range of contexts.

Homework

- Daily reading (aim for a minimum of 20 minutes a day)
- Weekly spellings will be sent home each Friday and tested the following Friday.
- This will start from this Friday 20.9.24
- Maths
- Times tables (e.g. TT Rockstars)

Lodge Hill


 This year, children will stay at the centre for one night.
