
RWInc is an accredited synthetic phonics programme, which uses speed sounds, FRED talk decoding and red words, to support fluency and comprehension in reading. Working progressively from the Early years, through to Year 2, and beyond.

Fred Talk



Fred the Frog, or Fred Fingers, plays an important role in our Read Write Inc lessons. **Fred is only able to speak in sounds, not whole words.** We call this Fred Talk.


For example, Fred would say 'm-a -t' we would say 'mat'.

Fred talk helps children read unfamiliar words by pronouncing each sound in the word one at a time




Comprehension



What can I do?

1. Use pure sounds rather than letter names.
 2. Use Fred Talk to help your child to read and spell words.
 3. Listen to your child read their Storybook every day.
 4. Watch the Virtual Classroom films together.
 5. Read stories to your child every day.

Example;

01.10.24 – Just let me sleep – to page 10

Confident reading, mostly fluent. Needed reminding to stop and take a breath at full stops. Discussed how exclamation marks change the way we read. Unsure on 'watch', needed support to recognise this red word.
