

Communication

As readers and writers, we will start the year with poetry after a morning around the campfire. We will then write to inform after a visit from an *old* friend of the Year 3 teachers: Urghh! Finally, we will go on a journey back to the Stone Age through the book 'Stone Age Boy' and will write a narrative to entertain about our adventures. We will look at various books from a variety of authors, as well as exploring texts about the Stone Age, Bronze Age and Iron Age, developing our fluency and ability to read for meaning.

As mathematicians, we will focus on place value and addition and subtraction during the first half term. The children will read, write and compare numbers to 1000, count in multiples of 10, 50, 100 and learn their 10 times table. The children will also be introduced to Times Table Rockstars!

As spiritual learners, we will start to explore Islam and compare it to our own religions and views. We will learn about Allah, Prophet Muhammad and key Islamic rituals and beliefs.

As linguists, we will learn how to greet people in French and how to share information about ourselves. We will also learn key vocabulary such as colours and adjectives. As historians, we will travel back in time to the Stone Age, Bronze Age and Iron Age. We will delve deep into the history of the local area and explore links to the Stone Age. Areas of focus are Cissbury Ring and Stonehenge. Children will compare different sources of evidence and hold debates about which is the most reliable.

Year 3 Which 'Age' would you prefer to live in?

As members of the school community, we will learn about the importance of staying safe online through Digital Literacy lessons. The children will discuss password security, keeping personal information safe, cyber bullying and the sensible use of technology.

As musicians, we will begin our weekly ukulele lessons with Mrs Eames. The children will learn all about the ukulele and start to play basic chords. They will also sing as part of an ensemble and explore rhythm.

Key texts and complimentary reading: 'Stig of the Dump' – Clive King 'How to Wash a Woolly Mammoth' – Michelle Robinson 'How to Live Like a Stone Age Hunter' — Anita Ganeri 'Stone Age Boy' - Satosh Kimua As computer scientists, we will learn the basics of touch typing through BBC Dance Mat Typing which can also be accessed at home. The children will then apply their typing skills to publish their fire poetry. We will learn how to edit the style and colour of text and add images to make it more eye-catching.

As athletes, we will develop our ball skills related to netball. The children will explore passing, moving and shooting as well as teamwork skills and how to live a healthy lifestyle. We will also complete the daily mile 3 times a week.

As designers, we will explore, design and evaluate a range of mechanisms that lift heavy loads. Inspired by the Stone Age, the children will design and make a mechanism capable of lifting into place the stones at Stonehenge.

As scientists, we will explore all types rocks and soils. The children will make observations, compare and test the different rocks and soils as well as think about their uses and features. We will also learn about how fossils are formed and create our own modern-day fossils of the future.


Additional information about learning


- In the Autumn term, Year 3 have PE on Tuesday and Friday

Reading





During our reading sessions, we will be encouraging children to make predictions explain what has happened in a story and bringing the text to life through drama.

How to support at home

Reading

- Your children should be reading every night for 20 minutes.
- Every other Monday, Year 3 will visit the library.
- When you read with your children, please do write a comment in their reading records.
- The adults they read with at school will also write in these.
- Whilst you are reading, please support your child to learn key words and ask questions about the books that they are reading. For example, sounded out "sunshine", using the 'ire' sound or could summarise the story so far.

English

- This year, the children will develop their writing skills by learning how to extend their sentences and create complex sentences.
- Spellings Spelling rules and common exception words will be taught twice a week and picked up in writing through 'Focus Five'.
- Weekly spellings will be sent home on Friday
- Children will develop their stamina for writing as well as learning to join their handwriting.
- We now use pen in school when the children write.

Maths

- Place Value Initial focus
- Real life problem solving
- Written and mental strategies
- Presentation of work Margin, Short date, 1 number per box
- To know by heart all the times tables up to x12 by the end of year 4
- Stick and Split focus for Autumn term.
- Children are encouraged to write 1 digit in each square.

Homework

- Weekly spellings will be sent home each Friday and tested the following Friday.
- Times table and number bond practice or targeted maths learning
 - Stick and Split (Autumn)
 - Times Table Rock Stars (Spring & Summer)
- Daily reading

- ► If you don't contact us, expect us to contact you!


Arrival and departure
