Country dancing club:

Country Dancing has returned for 2024! We are already busy preparing for the Horsham Schools Country Dance Festival and the Summer Fun Day and it's still not too late to join. In Year 2, the children have been learning all about factors and products. They have developed their reasoning and problem-solving skills. Ask Year 2 how many ways they can write a calculation using the commutative law.













Early Years this week the children loved exploring the cold weather. We enjoyed freezing different items and experimenting with how to get the objects free. Children suggested lots of ideas. such as leaving them out in the sun, taking them inside and breaking them free using different tools. The children have also been thinking about how to keep warm when it is cold. We have been writing lists of clothing and looking at the weather forecast to make sure we have the right clothing.



Year 1 had an exciting topic reveal... we felt some strange things inside the boxes and chose adjectives to match. We then talked about different animal groups - fish, reptiles, mammals, amphibians and birds. This term, we will be learning lots about these animal groups! We have already been learning and writing about mammals, fish and birds! Ask us which are warm blooded, which have backbones and which lay eggs!

Governors - Last Friday, 3 advisers from the Local Authority spent the morning in school to carry out their termly Progress Review of our school. This was extremely positive, with significant progress evident in all improvement areas. Advisers noted the following:

- Early Years is now in a very positive position and the learning taking place is clear.
- There is a clear strategic vision for SEND to ensure children get the right support at the right time.
- Systems for safeguarding are extremely robust.
- There is real evidence of improvement in the teaching of maths.

There is still more work to be done for these improvements to be embedded but there is commitment from staff at all levels to ensure this happens.
