#### Dear Parents and Carers,

What a long half term, the children really do deserve a rest over the holiday! I have been really impressed with how the children have worked and shown enthusiasm through the half term. Yesterday, we welcomed headteachers from the Trust schools in for the day. I felt very proud and excited to show them our wonderful children and school.

After the success of the neurodiversity workshop held a few weeks ago, we will be run a second session. This time it will focus on Managing Christmas with neurodiversity. This will be in the KS2 hall 4th December at 6pm.

We would like to gradually encourage children in Key Stage 2 to walk through to their classrooms on their own to help support their independence. In the morning, teachers are setting up classrooms and trying to work with children in the class so it is not an ideal time to talk to parents. Senior Leadership are always on the gates and are very happy to talk to parents about specific concerns and then pass these on during break time when the teachers are not teaching. If there is an emergency, the Senior Leadership Team will ensure the message is passed on immediately. Teachers are very happy to talk with parents at the end of the day and will also phone if needed. We work as a team and Senior Leaders are here to support in the mornings whilst teachers focus on the children. Thank you in advance for supporting us.

I was thrilled to see so many parents and friends in school yesterday to sit with their children and share their learning. It was an informal opportunity to come share your child's work which I hope you enjoyed.

Thank you for all of the positive comments received during parents evening last week and after the Early Years 6 weeks in meeting. It really does mean a lot for staff to receive these positives.

Lastly a big thank you to you all for supporting us and working with us to make Billingshurst the best it can be.
