English

As readers and writers, we will be inspired by our holidays to write entertaining poems about the creative things we didn't do. We will then use the learning from history to write about Pompeii. This will be linked to the text 'Escape from Pompeii'. Finally we will be trying to rally the Celts into action by writing a persuasive speech in role as Queen Boudicca.

Maths

As mathematicians, we will be developing our knowledge of place value up to ten thousand. We will learn how to order and compare, round and estimate numbers using different representations. We will then explore this further by learning to solve practical problems involving increasingly larger positive numbers.

Science

As scientists, we will be exploring states of matter. We will be deciding if a material is a solid, liquid or a gas. This will move onto exploring gases in fizzy drinks. We will look at changes in state through heating and cooling before looking at evaporation by setting up our own investigations into what speeds this process up.

D

We will be exploring puppets and how they work before establishing a design brief for puppets of our own. We will then design and create puppets based on our Romans theme. This will involve sewing and precision cutting of materials.

Why did the Romans settle in Britain?

History

As historians, we will be exploring the Romans and the chronology of this time period. We will use a range of sources and artefacts to answer questions about the past and learn about the significant historical events that have shaped Britain today.

E4S

As members of the school community, we will be learning about the importance of staying safe online. We will consider what information should be kept private and how to ensure we show kindness when using online platforms.

Languages

As linguists, we will be learning to be more precise with our French language when asking for something. Children will learn the different names of vegetables and formulate these into short, expressive sentences.

Religious Education

As spiritual learners, we will be exploring the origins and key teachings of Judaism. We will then explore different Jewish artefacts and visual symbols to gain a greater understanding of Jewish religious practises.

Physical Education

As athletes, the children will be working on their catching, passing and defending skills in hand ball. Two classes will also be developing their vital swimming skills, whilst the other class will be creating and performing dances using a variety of movement patterns.


Additional information about learning


- In the Autumn term, Year 4 have PE on Mondays (outdoors) and Thursdays (swimming and indoors).

Reading





During our reading sessions, we will be encouraging children to make predictions explain what has happened in a story and bringing the text to life through drama.

How to support at home

Reading

- Your children should be reading every night for 20 minutes.
- Every other Week, Year 4 will visit the library.
- When you read with your children, please do write a comment in their reading records.
- The adults they read with at school will also write in these.
- Whilst you are reading, please support your child to learn key words and ask questions about the books that they are reading. For example, sounded out "sunshine", using the 'ire' sound or could summarise the story so far.

English

- This year, the children will develop their writing skills by learning how to extend their sentences with conjunctions to create complex and compound sentences.
- Spellings Spelling rules and common exception words will be taught twice a week and picked up in writing through 'Focus Five'
- Weekly spellings will be sent home on Friday (coming soon)
- Children will develop their stamina for writing as well as learning to develop a more fluent style of handwriting.
- The children are now using pen in school for most of their writing.

Maths

- Place Value Initial focus
- Real life problem solving
- Written and mental strategies
- Presentation of work Margin, Short date, 1 number per box
- To know by heart all the times tables up to x12 ready for the multiplication check in June
- Times Table Rockstars focus

Homework

- Weekly spellings will be sent home each Friday and tested the following Friday. (watch this space)
