

Spotlight: Mr Fish







Three children from Year 6 (Kellan, Amelie and Lucas) interviewed Mr Fish (Premises Manager) about his role in school........

Q. What is your job in school?

A. I do most things at school, I maintain the grounds and buildings and repair things that children break. This can be toys in EYFS right through to the toilets in KS2.

Q. What do you do every day?

A. I have set jobs every day and have to check things regularly. I really like the bits in between that change every day. On a snowy day I have to be here before everyone else to clear the paths before the children can come in. I also had lots to do when we didn't have water in the village and when we had a problem with the drain on the field.

Q. What do you like most about your job?

A. I like the variety – no two days are the same. I also like to see your smiling faces every day.

Q. What is the most unusual thing that you've found on the school field?

A. I sometimes find parts of animals where the foxes have had them. I also find parts of fireworks in November that have landed on the field.

Q. How long have you worked at BPS?

A. I have worked here for over 30 years. I see people that I was caretaker for and they are now picking up their own children. Did you know that Mrs Tanner came to Billingshurst Primary as a child and I was her caretaker too!

Q. What do you like to do outside of school?

A. I used to like classic cars but now I like spending time with my grandchildren; we go to zoos, Fishers Farm, Chessington and the seaside.
